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## STP Online: Now You Try It!

### Week Two – Digital Video

Your assignment this week is to incorporate digital video as a part of your curriculum. Choose **one** of the following four options:

1. **Evaluate five curriculum videos from eMedia.** Choose five different videos from eMedia from your specific content area and write an evaluation on each video. Evaluation should include:
  - a. *Title of the Video*
  - b. *Curriculum Area and Grade Level*
  - c. *One Paragraph Summary of the video.*
  - d. *One Paragraph evaluation of the video where you share a possible activity or lesson plan idea for using the video in class.*
2. **Create a movie using your iPad or other mobile device.** Using an iPad, create a *two -three* minute movie you could use with students. This shouldn't be a "home movie", but rather a chance to create a movie which helps students learn about a specific topic. Topics should be related to the curriculum, but can include character education as well (ie. teaching manners, citizenship, etc). This video should be edited using the iMovie app on the iPad (\$4.99 in the app store) and once complete should be uploaded as an attachment in Canvas. Please describe your video in a one-paragraph summary in the Submission window in Canvas.
3. **Create a Digital Story using Windows Movie Maker.** Using Windows Movie Maker, create a digital story of a favorite's children story or a power point you wish to narrate. Your project should include the following:
  - a. Title Slide
  - b. Digital images from the book or powerpoint (you may need to scan the book or use a digital camera to take photos of the pages.).
  - c. Narration of the movie
  - d. Please upload the video as an attachment in Canvas. Also, please describe your video in a one-paragraph summary in the Submission window in Canvas.
4. Reflect on the importance of using digital video in the classroom. You should answer the questions in the **Digital Video Reflection** in a 1-2 page document. *Remember you can only use the reflection option three times throughout the course.*
